10 minutes

Once you've painted the wall in whites and it's dry, decide on the basic layout of the design and at what height it should begin. Wipe a piece of chalk along the length of your string. Pin it to the wall at one end and select the angle.



20 minutes

Hold the string taut and 'ping' it to leave a line. Using the tape, mask along the line, then repeat for the intersecting lines. Repeat for the other colours.



30 minutes (+ drying)

Stir paint well before pouring into the tray. Paint up to and slightly over the tape line with a roller in Caramel Latte **Simply Refresh One** Coat. Leave to dry.



10 minutes

Carefully remove the masking tape and admire the results.

"When my husband and I moved into our new-build home in Aberdeenshire, all the walls were white. Rather than just picking a colour and painting a wall, we wanted to do something different. We spend most of our time in our living-dining room and in the corner is our Cockapoo Skye's dog bed. Her space looked so dull, so we decided to brighten it up. I found the idea of using geometrics on Pinterest. The colours we chose were inspired by one of the pieces of art we have by Scott Naismith. He paints vivid pictures of the Isle of Skye, which also inspired Skye's name, so it seemed fitting to choose similar bold shades to create this colourful corner. Now she doesn't have to look at a boring wall all day!"











BRING IN THE SUNSHINE

"We moved home last December, just before going into lockdown. So although we were in the house from Christmas until April, we didn't feel fully settled in. All the homeware shops were closed and we couldn't buy new furniture. It became a priority for me to make my house a home. Our bedroom was the first room I wanted to decorate - making it feel cosy, warm and colourful was important. I'm very attracted to colour, it injects so much personality into a space.

YMCA DICKERAGE COMMUNITY CENTRE

fter supporting local residents for more than 30 years, the YMCA Dickerage Sport and Community Centre in Kingston upon Thames needed a revamp. It was the ideal opportunity for Dulux to lend a hand. In partnership with VIY (Volunteer It Yourself), an organisation that transforms community buildings across the UK, Dulux helped at-risk young people learn professional decorating skills, and also donated paint as part of the Let's Colour initiative. "We've had many young people helping on the project... and [the centre] is now more multicultural and multi-generational than ever before," says Dan Slocombe, Centre Manager.









GRAMPIAN WA

he mural in this Slough playground is more than bright colours - it's the result of a community coming together. Created by a local artist using paint supplied by Dulux, left over from the TV programme Changing Rooms, of which Dulux is an official sponsor, it's a backdrop that celebrates diversity. Local volunteers, as well as employees from Dulux's parent company, AkzoNobel, helped with the project.

It's 18 years since a previous mural was created on the wall, which also used paint donated by Dulux. An untouched piece of the original remains as a tribute to the 2003 project. "We knew that the playground was a lifeline for the community during lockdown and is important to many nearby, so creating a new mural here was the perfect project," says Alison Furness at AkzoNobel.







IDEA #3

PAIR BOLD SHADES WITH NEUTRALS

here are no fixed rules for using colour but if you're new to painting in brighter shades. remember that you don't have to go all in - less can be more. Rather than coating all four walls in a bold hue, use colour for the woodwork, a feature wall, or even just a section of a wall. Using colour sparingly like this is an easy way to highlight features in the room or to define different areas. For example, if you have an archway, try painting it in an eye-catching shade to create an interesting focal point, or use colour to carve out a workspace zone.

Accents can work all around your home, so take a look around and consider adding a splash of colour in unexpected areas. Why not create a cheerful welcome in the hallway by giving your staircase a colour makeover? Just paint some of the uprights in your favourite shade, while keeping the rest in a neutral

tone. The staircase above has risers painted in soothing Polished Pebble, with a pop of Vanilla Sundae* every third step. Skirting, balusters and a banister painted in Black frame the lighter shades and add impact. DO use roller testers – and plenty of them. Rather than paint the colour directly on the wall, paint pieces of A4 card or lining paper, and use the advised amount of coats (usually two). This will allow you to move them around the room, so you can see what each colour looks like on every wall. Put the painted cards next to artwork, behind furniture or above floors so you can see how the colour looks.

DON'T make hurried decisions. Try viewing the painted cards from adjoining rooms, at different times of the day with different light sources, and mix and match them until the right combinations appear.

DO consider natural light. For example, a north-facing room tends to have cooler natural light, so warmer shades often look better - think colours with pink, gold and yellow tones rather than those with blueish undertones. East-facing rooms are bright early on but become cooler as the day progresses, so opt for blues and greens to balance out the morning light.

DON'T forget about formulation. It's important that your newly painted walls will stay looking good for years to come as well as be the right colour. Dulux EasyCare is perfect for busy homes and high-traffic areas, such as hallways, lounges and dining rooms.





The ultimate toolkit

Choose your tools correctly first time around and you can reuse them again and again

THE BASICS

Don't spend a fortune on lots of tools. Instead, invest in the essentials upfront, and buy additional items as and when you need them



Synthetic-bristle brushes

Versatile, long-lasting and well suited to the application of water-based paints, a collection of different-sized synthetic-bristle brushes will see you through most decorating projects.



Roller and tray

For large surface areas, a roller is recommended as it applies paint faster and with a more even finish. A medium-pile roller should do the trick for both ceilings and walls.

THE PREP SET

Spend that little bit of extra time on prep before you begin painting - it will make the rest of the decorating process much less painful!



Dust sheets

Protect floors and furniture by covering exposed surfaces with good-quality dust sheets that you can keep and reuse for every project.



Filling knife

Achieve a great-looking finish on surfaces by using a filling knife to apply the right filler to damaged areas. Be sure you swap to a more flexible filler (decorators' caulk) where walls meet woodwork.



Sandpaper and sanding blocks

Buy different grades of sandpaper to make prep smoother. Look out for flexible blocks as these can be used on a variety of surfaces, such as doors and skirting.

THE PAINT PICKS

Add to your decorating arsenal as you work on different projects around the house - building your toolkit as you go means you don't end up buying unnecessary items



Stirring stick

Paint can separate in the tin, so stir it well before applying to ensure the colour and consistency are as they should be.



Stepladder

Being able to reach all areas in the room safely is crucial, so make sure you use a good-quality stepladder that's tall enough for the job.



Extension pole

Painting large surface areas and hard-to-reach places can be made easier by attaching your roller to the end of an extension pole.



EXPERT KNOW-HOW Matt Gray

"Keep the door to the room you're working in firmly shut, so kids and pets stay safely out of the way. Ensure ventilation is good before you begin, to reduce the smell and help fresh paint dry. Wear safety glasses to shield your eyes from any spray from the roller. Finally, decorate in decent natural light and avoid the temptation to rush. Good work takes time - and the results are worth it."



Dusting cloths and brush

Have dusting cloths and a brush to hand as they're useful for getting rid of dust and wiping down surfaces before painting, especially if you've sanded beforehand.



Masking tape

Invest in masking tape to protect surfaces you don't want to get paint on. Good-quality tapes also reduce the risk of paint seeping underneath and give visibly sharper, cleaner lines.



Additional rollers

Like brushes, rollers come in all different sizes, so there shouldn't be any surface area you can't paint.



Clean brushes with this dedicated comb. Used at an angle to remove excess paint from bristles, it makes cleaning easier and quicker.

Get the edge

Wondering which masking tape to use for which job? Here's our handu quide



Turn to this general, all-purpose tape when you're creating sharp lines and graphic shapes on a wall. Its medium adhesion makes it great for masking cured painted surfaces, wood trims, glass and metal. Tape in 30-60cm sections to avoid stretching it.

A good one to keep in your toolkit, this thin low-adhesion tape is ideal for masking off everything from wallpaper to freshly painted surfaces that haven't cured yet, leaving a crisp painted line behind.



This tape is the one to turn to if you're masking off curvy shapes, such as circles, arches and waves. It's stretchy and flexible, making it easy to follow undulating lines, and has medium adhesion, so it stays put while you're creating your masterpiece.

When applying tape, use short strips so they won't get tangled, and overlap the edges. Then seal the edges by running your fingers back and forth over them.






